

Continued Support of Louisiana Recovery FEMA Public Assistance Weekly Update

- Over \$7.8M in Public Assistance funding was obligated to Cameron Parish School for the replacement of buildings at South Cameron High and South Cameron Elementary Schools.
- Over \$691.5K in Public Assistance funding was obligated to East Baton Rouge Parish School Board for reimbursement for maintaining temporary facilities throughout the school system.
- Over \$1.6M in Public Assistance funding was obligated to the City of New Orleans for project management costs for the city's telecommunication infrastructure repair and District Attorney's Office.
- Over \$3.3M in Public Assistance funding was obligated to St. Bernard Parish for hazard mitigation to various lift stations throughout the parish.
- Over \$802K in Public Assistance funding was obligated to Washington Parish for parish wide debris removal.
