<u>Project Description</u>: Project activities include replacing backflow preventer in boiler room, water chiller compressors, powered ventilators, acoustical ceiling tile, single pane windows, wood soffit, wood fascia, and aluminum bleachers; repairing electrical service and fire alarm system; backfilling and grading where trees had been uprooted; removing and replacing built up roof, stainless steel flashing, gypsum wallboard, tectum roof decking, acoustical ceiling tile, standing seam roof panels, insulation, fascia metal trim, and asphalt shingles; installing wood block pipe supports for a gas line; and removing asbestos shingles and replacing with tab asphalt shingles. Some mitigation will be achieved by compliance with current codes and standards and by good construction practices.
