Per 44 CFR 9.12, a final public notice is to be published 15 days prior to the start of any construction activities. Documentation of completed public notice is to be forwarded to FEAM and LA GOHSEP for inclusion in the permanent project files.
- 2. Unusable equipment, debris and material shall be disposed of in an approved manner and location. In the event significant items (or evidence thereof) are discovered during implementation of the project applicant shall handle, manage, and dispose of petroleum products, hazardous materials and/or toxic waste in accordance to the requirements and to the satisfaction of the governing local, state and federal agencies.
- 3. Removal and disposal of debris containing household hazardous waste and certain categories of liquid wastes must be performed in accordance with all applicable Federal and State Laws, Regulations, Executive Orders and Guidelines.
