(Review Concluded) Comments: The structures do not meet the 50-year-criterion, nor do they possess the level of exceptional importance required by criteria consideration of the National Register Guidelines to be considered eligible for the National Register of Historic Places. Scope of work indicates ground disturbing activities associated with demolishing the structure and excavating to lay a new slab on or adjacent to the demolished building site. Upon consultation of data provided by the State Historic Preservation Office (SHPO), there is one known archaeological sites within 0.5 miles of one of the project areas. However all work should occur on previously disturbed soils. Therefore the undertaking should not affect historic properties.
