

Nu' uuli and Malaeimi Scheduled to Register With FEMA for Assistance

PAGO PAGO, American Samoa – The American Samoa Government (ASG) and FEMA announced the schedule for additional residents to register for assistance. Only heads of households need to register.

Residents who were affected by Tropical Storm Gita may use the following schedule to register for assistance at the Disaster Recovery Center (DRC).

- **Monday, March 19 residents of Nu' uuli, Numbers 0001 – 0250**
- **Tuesday, March 20 residents of Nu' uuli, Numbers 0251 – 0369 and**
- **Tuesday, March 20 residents of Nu' uuli, Numbers 0501 – 0633**
- **Wednesday, March 21 residents of Nu' uuli, Numbers 0634 – 0731 and**
- **Wednesday, March 21 residents of Malaeimi, Numbers 0001 – 0143**

The DRC is located at the **Department of Youth and Women Affairs, Pago Pago Sports Village, Pago Pago, AS 96799**. The center will be open from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. Only heads of household need to attend.

Please remember, applicants should have the following information at hand:

- Social Security number.
- Address of the damaged primary residence.
- Description of the damage.
- Information about insurance coverage if applicable.
- A current contact telephone number.
- An address where they can receive mail.
- Bank account and routing numbers for direct deposit of funds.

The Territory and FEMA will announce a schedule soon for other Villages to register at the DRC for federal assistance.



If elderly heads of household and individuals with special needs will call the Crisis Hotline at (684) 633-9017, the FEMA Disaster Survivor Assistance (DSA) Teams will register them. This eliminates the need for a trip to the DRC to register. Slips with DSA written on them indicate they are already registered with FEMA.
