## One Week Left to Apply for FEMA Assistance

**OKLAHOMA CITY** – Oklahomans affected by the May 19-28 severe storms, straight-line winds, tornadoes and flooding have one week left to apply for FEMA assistance.

The deadline to apply is August 14.

If you were affected by the storms in Blaine, Caddo, Custer, Delaware, Jackson, Mayes, Muskogee and Rogers counties, you should apply as soon as possible. FEMA may be able to help with rent, home repairs and other disaster-related needs.
