

If you were impacted by the disaster and cannot fully recover using your personal resources, insurance, government grants or loans there is a group in your community that can help called the Long Term Recovery Group.

These groups are made up of a wide range of members including local voluntary, faith-based, civic, and community organizations. They are non-governmental and non-profit groups whose goal is to help those affected by the disaster rebuild their lives.

The Long Term Recovery Group provides money, materials and services that can help you repair or rebuild your home, replace personal property and assistive technology, assist with transportation, and connect you with a case manager that can help you set up a recovery plan and find funding and services to match your needs.

Remember, before you meet with a representative, give prior notice if you need an accommodation and be clear about what you need.
