SUBJECT: Migration of the Authorized Equipment List to the Lessons Learned Information Sharing *LLIS.gov* Website

The Authorized Equipment List (AEL), published by the FEMA Grant Programs Directorate, is now on the Responder Knowledge Base (RKB) section of the FEMA Lessons Learned Information Sharing (*LLIS.gov*) Website at <https://www.llis.dhs.gov/knowledgebase>. The AEL move to *LLIS.gov* is part of FEMA's efforts to unify key information sources that support decision making and foster innovation across the emergency management and homeland security communities. It will enhance the user experience by bringing together critical information on equipment, standards, grants, lessons learned and best practices.

The AEL is currently available for download in two formats:

- PDF Format
- MS Excel Format

The AEL is used to determine the equipment allowable under multiple FEMA Preparedness Grant programs. These versions of the AEL apply to FY 2005 and later Fiscal Years unless otherwise noted in the individual item.

The interactive version of the AEL will be provided on *LLIS.gov* in the coming weeks, and will include links and information on mandatory & relevant standards and eligible FEMA Preparedness Grants. As a part of the overall transition of the Responder Knowledge Base (RKB) to *LLIS.gov*, additional information such as certifications and declarations for P25, the Integrated Public Alert and Warning System (IPAWS), and other related content will become available on *LLIS.gov* over the course of the next couple of months.
