

FY 2014 PORT SECURITY GRANT PROGRAM (PSGP) FUNDING OPPORTUNITY ANNOUNCEMENT (FOA) – KEY CHANGES

OVERVIEW INFORMATION

There were no changes made under the program's Overview Information section of the FOA.

FOA EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

In FY2014 there is a limitation on applications. Only one application per entity per Port Area is permitted. Applicants with facilities in multiple port areas may submit only one application but may submit up to 3 IJs within the single application.

FULL FOA

Section II. Funding Information-

- Port-Wide Risk Management Plans no longer a requirement of Group 1 and 2 ports.

Appendix A

In the FY 2014 PSGP, Group 1 designation for funding will include seven port areas where as in FY2013 Group 1 designation had eight port areas. In FY 2014 San Diego's risk score decreased, and the logical break in the risk curve for Group I dropped to seven port areas.

- Vulnerability assessments for cybersecurity activities may now be funded as contracted costs.
- PSGP encourages use of the Qualified Technology List (QTL) instead of the ICE list
- PSGP projects funded under 46 U.S.C. § 70107(b)(2) (including Construction Projects) may not exceed \$1,000,000. The Secretary of Homeland Security may approve a greater amount of per project funding, so long as that greater amount does not exceed 10 percent of total amount of PSGP funding provided to the grantee.
