



Mr. Roger L. Stone was appointed to his current position as the Deputy Assistant Administrator for National Continuity Programs (NCP) on January 30, 2015. Prior to his appointment, Mr. Stone has served NCP in various capacities, since 2010 – most recently as the NCP Executive Officer. He brings more than a decade of national continuity experience to his position, having directed Presidential contingency programs, participated in Executive Branch continuity policy development, conducted inter-agency training, testing and evaluation (TT&E), and conducted contingency operations at the strategic, operational, and tactical levels.

Mr. Stone brings nearly 30 years of government service to the agency.
