**SUBJECT:** Information Bulletin # 405a - Revised Fiscal Year 2015 Tribal  
Homeland Security Grant Program Allocation

This Information Bulletin (IB) amends, in part, IB 405, the Fiscal Year (FY) 2015 Preparedness Grant Programs Allocation Announcement. Specifically, this IB revises the FY 2015 Tribal Homeland Security Grant Program (THSGP) allocation, which was originally announced in IB 405 on Tuesday, July 28, 2015.

The following Tribes are impacted by the revised allocation:

- 1) Dry Creek Rancheria Band of Pomo Indians
- 2) Navajo Nation

As part of the FY 2015 THSGP Allocation Announcement, the Dry Creek Rancheria Band of Pomo Indians, located within the borders of California, was allocated \$128,600. The Tribe formally rescinded its FY 2015 application prior to receiving its award.

Accordingly, DHS/FEMA increased the award amount for the Navajo Nation, located within the borders of Arizona, by \$128,600, thereby bringing the Navajo Nation's total award amount to \$1,764,852. The Navajo Nation's award was increased because its initial allocation of \$1,636,252 was lower than the total requested amount of \$3,700,000. Allocations were made until the available FY 2015 THSGP funding was exhausted leaving the Navajo Nation with an allocation less than the total requested amount.
