



Emergency Preparedness Courses

Introduction to Emergency Preparedness Course (H-107)

Description

This instructor-led course provides participants with a brief overview of emergency preparedness fundamentals. Areas covered include: the history of emergency preparedness (EP) philosophy and requirements; EP requirements (10 CFR Part 50.47 and Appendix E); EP guidance (e.g. NUREG-0654); the sixteen emergency planning standards; emergency classification system; emergency action levels; protective action recommendations; changes made to licensee emergency plans; drills and exercises; the EP ROP inspection program; the EP SDP; NRC interface with FEMA; EP current events; threat-based EP; and interface with the NRC Operations Center.

The course duration is 8 hours. This course is taught at the NRC Professional Development Center in Rockville, MD. NRC Employees have admission priority to this course.
