

**FEMA PUBLIC NOTICE OF AVAILABILITY
ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENT AND
FINDING OF NO SIGNIFICANT IMPACT FOR
Temporary Group Manufactured Housing Unit Site
VICTORIA GROUP SITE
EAST BATON ROUGE PARISH, LOUISIANA**

Interested parties are hereby notified that the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) has prepared a draft Environmental Assessment (EA) for a proposed temporary group Manufactured Housing Unit (MHU) site. The site may provide suitable temporary housing opportunities for individuals and families displaced due to severe flooding. A major disaster declaration was signed by the President on August 14, 2016, for severe storms and flooding (FEMA-4277-DR-LA).

An 8-acre site for approximately 35 manufactured housing units (MHU) is being considered on Victoria Drive, Baton Rouge, Louisiana, East Baton Rouge Parish. The site under consideration is a T-shaped parcel of land approximately 0.5 miles north of Greenwell Springs Rd. and south of Winbourn Ave. Activities may include, where necessary, site clearing, grading, road construction, the placement of utilities (electricity, telephones, water, and sewer), and the transport and installation of manufactured homes to the site. In accordance with the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969 (NEPA), the Council on Environmental Quality (CEQ) regulations implementing NEPA (40 Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) Parts 1500 – 1508), FEMA’s Instruction 108-1-1 for implementing NEPA, the National Historic Preservation Act, Executive Order 11988, Executive Order 11990, and 44 CFR Part 9, a draft EA was written to evaluate the potential impacts of the proposed action on the human and natural environment. In order to meet the urgent need of flood survivors to find temporary housing, FEMA has conducted an expedited environmental review process to identify and address environmental issues. The draft EA summarizes the purpose and need, site selection process, affected environment, and potential environmental consequences associated with the proposed action.

Due to the emergency nature of this action, the public comment period will be brief; the three-day comment period will end on October 30, 2016. Written comments on the draft EA and Finding of No Significant Impact (FONSI) can be faxed to FEMA’s Joint Field Office in Baton Rouge at (225) 382-1560; or sent via email to FEMA-R6-EHP@fema.dhs.gov. The draft EA is also available for public review at the Main Library of the East Baton Rouge Public Library, located at 7711 Goodwood Blvd., Baton Rouge, LA 70806. The Main Library facility hours are Monday to Thursday, 8:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m., Friday and Saturday, 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m., and Sunday 2:00 p.m. to 10:00 p.m. If no substantive comments are received, the draft EA and FONSI will become final and no further public notices will be circulated.
