## AIR TACTICAL GROUP SUPERVISOR

<b>RESOURCE CATEGORY</b>	Emergency Management
<b>RESOURCE KIND</b>	Personnel
<b>OVERALL FUNCTION</b>	The Air Tactical Group Supervisor coordinates with the Air Support Group Supervisor and monitors missions in-flight to ensure safety and updates aircrews of changes, diverts, or recalls
<b>COMPOSITION AND ORDERING SPECIFICATIONS</b>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. This position can be ordered as a single resource</li> <li>2. Discuss logistics for this position, such as security, lodging, transportation, and meals, prior to deployment</li> <li>3. The position typically works 12 hours per shift, is self-sustainable for 72 hours, and is deployable up to 14 days</li> <li>4. Requestor specifies any additional qualifications necessary based on incident complexity and needs</li> </ol>

Each type of resource builds on the qualifications of the type below it. For example, Type 1 qualifications include the qualifications in Type 2, plus an increase in capability. Type 1 is the highest qualification level.

COMPONENT	SINGLE TYPE	NOTES
<b>DESCRIPTION</b>	<p>The Air Tactical Group Supervisor:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Coordinates the take-offs of daily assigned missions</li> <li>2. Coordinates with the Air Support Group Supervisor on aircrew and aircraft status for the daily mission assignments</li> <li>3. Monitors missions in-flight to ensure safety and updates aircrews of changes, diverts, or recalls</li> <li>4. Assists crew with in-flight emergencies (IFE) and coordinates with the Air Support Group Supervisor when necessary</li> <li>5. Coordinates with the Air Support Group Supervisor to divert aircraft to alternate airfields due to weather, crosswinds, or other special needs of the aircraft or crew</li> <li>6. Coordinates with the Air Support Group Supervisor to update on mission status or any significant events of which the Air Operations Branch Director needs to be aware</li> <li>7. Coordinates with the Air Support Group Supervisor to report mission information to the Air Operations Branch Director for the operational planning worksheet and daily situation report</li> <li>8. Establishes or transitions into a group under the Operations Section in the Incident Command System (ICS)</li> </ol>	Not Specified

Experience in an air operations position AND participation in three or more exercise activations or real-world activations with one or more operational periods</li> </ol>	Military rating (current or former) as a pilot or navigator may fulfill this recommended experience
<b>PHYSICAL / MEDICAL FITNESS</b>	Performs duties under moderate circumstances characterized by working consecutive 12-hour days under physical and emotional stress for sustained periods of time	Not Specified
<b>CURRENCY</b>	Functions in this position during an operational incident, exercise, drill, or simulation at least once every two years	Military experience may fulfill this recommended currency
