FATALITY MANAGEMENT DISASTER PORTABLE MORGUE UNIT SUPPLY SPECIALIST

RESOURCE CATEGORY	Public Health, Healthcare, and Emergency Medical Services
RESOURCE KIND	Personnel
OVERALL FUNCTION	The Fatality Management (FM) Disaster Portable Morgue Unit (DPMU) Supply Specialist manages equipment and supplies for the incident.
COMPOSITION AND ORDERING SPECIFICATIONS	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. This position can be ordered as a single resource or in conjunction with a NIMS typed unit (Disaster Portable Morgue Unit) 2. Discuss logistics for this position, such as security, lodging, transportation, and meals, prior to deployment 3. The position typically works 12 hours per shift, is self-sustainable for 72 hours, and is deployable up to 14 days

Each type of resource builds on the qualifications of the type below it. For example, Type 1 qualifications include the qualifications in Type 2, plus an increase in capability. Type 1 is the highest qualification level.

Performs duties with sights and smells associated with death, including encountering child victims, grieving survivors, and family members of missing victims4. Maintains immunizations in accordance with the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's (CDC) recommended adult immunization schedule for the United States of America	Not Specified
CURRENCY	Functions in this position during an operational incident, exercise, drill, or simulation at least once every two years	Not Specified
