At long last we are submitting to you, for FEMA approval, the construction plans for our new facility. Should you need any additional information other than what we have sent you, please let me know.

We have bought a parcel of land in the City of Daphne, Alabama, Baldwin County consisting of 6.36 acres. The property is approximately 146 feet above sea level and is next to the Albert P Brewer Development Center off of Pinehill Rd in the City of Daphne, Alabama. We have received zoning approval from the City of Daphne as well as preliminary approval for the construction of our building. The results of the environmental review done on the property have indicated that there is no reason that The Shoulder building cannot be constructed on this parcel of land.

We plan to build a facility containing approximately 22,500 square feet. Because of the cost savings, it is our plan to build a pre-manufactured building designed and built by Kings Custom Builders, Inc. I have looked at other buildings designed and built by this company that have been approved by the Joint Commission of Accreditation of Hospitals as well as buildings designed and built by them for schools and churches. The plans that have been sent to you have been approved by the Alabama Manufactured Housing Commission and will be approved by the Daphne Building Commission prior to construction. The cost of building and site work appears to be approximately \$2,250,000.





The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) has determined under the Endangered Species Act and Migratory Bird Treaty Act that the construction of the new Shoulder of the Central Gulf Coast Center on a 6.36-acre site in Daphne, AL "may affect, but is not likely to adversely affect" federally listed threatened or endangered species, critical habitat. FEMA is requesting U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS) concurrence with this determination. Project details are outlined below and in several attachments to this letter.

The Shoulder of the Gulf Coast Center sustained widespread damage during Hurricane Katrina necessitating the temporary relocation and construction of new facilities. The new center will be constructed utilizing funding from FEMA's Public Assistance Program under the presidential disaster declaration DR-1605-AL, declared August 29, 2005. It has been deemed that to prevent repetitive loss at the existing location, the facility will be built on a new site located at Roper Lane in Daphne, Alabama. The 6.36-acre site where the facility will be constructed is adjacent to the facility The Shoulder is currently operating. Please see the attached map of the vicinity and new facility site and construction area.

Review of USFWS Alabama data, obtained from the USFWS Daphne Ecological Services Office website in February 2010, of threatened and endangered species and critical habitat indicates that there are no known occurrences of federally listed species within the vicinity of the site. There is potential critical habitat for one federally listed species within the vicinity of the site, specifically the Red-cockaded woodpecker. Through review of current land use and aerial photos, FEMA has determined that the critical habitat does not occur within the area where the new center will be constructed. The critical habitat within the vicinity occurs near or within the surrounding wooded areas. The new facility will be built south of the Lake Forest subdivision. The site is a cleared open field, adjacent to a facility that is currently in use. Prior to the storm, the adjacent facility was a state owned office building that was not

fully in use. The facility is surrounded by small neighborhoods and large tracks of wooded areas. Please see the attached aerial photos. The known land use makes the occurrence of critical habitat within the cleared area unlikely. The project includes construction of parking and drainage network, which includes a retention pond. Use of best-management practices during construction will minimize effects to listed species and critical habitat in the surrounding wooded area.

The Department of Conservation and Natural Resources has reviewed the above mentioned project and submits the following comments:


- A review of available information by the Wildlife and Freshwater Fisheries Division, personnel has determined that this project is unlikely to impact any state-protected species. However, the project site may be occupied by gopher tortoises, a state-protected species in Baldwin County. This species prefers open habitats that support a wide variety of herbaceous ground cover vegetation for forage and frequently can be found in disturbed habitats such as roadsides, fence-rows, old fields, and the edges of overgrown (unburned) uplands. The site should be inspected for the presence of gopher tortoise burrows. If gopher tortoise burrows are on the site, please contact Matthew Marshall (334-242-3851) of the Wildlife and Freshwater Fisheries Division for additional guidance. See <http://www.gophertortoisecouncil.org/> for more information.
- State water quality standards (particularly those related to erosion control) should be strictly adhered to. We encourage the proper installation and implementation of best management practices as outlined in the Alabama Handbook for Erosion Control in order to minimize erosion and migration of sediments into wetland and stream areas. Appropriate siltation barriers include: green zones, sod strips, silt fences, erosion eels or other superior means of erosion control that will minimize siltation area authorized in the finalize permit.
- The Natural Heritage Section of the State Lands Division has developed the following information pertaining to federally listed plant species and federally

listed invertebrate species not covered by state game regulations. Based on database records, no federally listed candidate, threatened or endangered species are located within the 0316020405 watershed. This does not suggest that protected species do not occur at this location. A survey conducted by trained professionals is the most accurate way to ensure that no sensitive species are jeopardized by the development activities. This does not constitute any form of Section 7 consultation. We recommend that the USFWS Field Office in Daphne be contacted for Section 7 consultations.

The Department has received and evaluated the information you sent us regarding the above-referenced project. You had requested that we review this information and provide comments.

Please note that State law and ADEM regulations require that appropriate, effective Best Management Practices (BMPs) for the control of pollutants in stormwater run-off be fully implemented and maintained as needed for all construction and land disturbance activities regardless of permit status or size of the disturbance to prevent/minimize discharges of sediment and other pollutants to waters of the State of Alabama.

A "water of the state" is broadly defined as [§ 22-22-1(b)(2), Code of Alabama 1975, as amended] "All waters of any river, stream, watercourse, pond, lake, coastal, ground, or surface water, wholly or partially within the state, natural or artificial. This does not include waters which are entirely confined and retained completely upon the property of a single individual, partnership, or corporation unless such waters are used in interstate commerce." Discharges of pollutants resulting from failure to implement and maintain effective BMPs are considered unpermitted discharges to state waters.

Please be advised that pursuant to EPA rules and ADEM Admin. Project details are outlined below and in several attachments to this letter.

The facility owned, operated and maintained by The Shoulder of the Central Coast, Inc. (The Shoulder) sustained widespread damage during Hurricane Katrina. The Shoulder is a private non-profit organization whose mission and purpose is to provide long-term residential and outpatient treatment for those with alcohol and/or chemical addictions. This treatment facility was located along Old Spanish Fort Parkway on an island in Mobile Bay in the Spanish Fort, Baldwin County. The Shoulder applied to FEMA's Public Assistance Program under the presidential disaster declaration DR-1605-AL, declared August 29, 2005. 



Our Tribe maintains ancestral associations throughout the state of Alabama despite the absence of written documentation to completely identify Tribal activities, villages, trails, or burial sites. However, it is our objective to ensure significances of Native American ancestry, especially of the Alabama-Coushatta Tribe, are administered with the utmost considerations.

Upon review of your April 20, 2010 submission, immediate impacts to religious, cultural, or historical assets of the Alabama-Coushatta Tribe of Texas could not be ascertained. The proposed location exists in direct proximity to migratory routes and habitation sites utilized by ancestral members of the Alabama and Coushatta Tribes. As a habitable location, usage would have been seasonal while migratory routes were extensive, meandering north to south and east to west, either by season or time periods. At this time, we have no immediate objections to the proceeding of this proposal.

In lieu of the aforementioned presence, we do request immediate notification of the inadvertent discovery of human remains and/or archaeological artifacts as well as a cease of activity in proximity to the location until formal consultations with our office are concluded.
