The planning process is as important as the plan itself. The subapplication describes: the overall approach to the planning process; who the key stakeholders are; what the primary sources of information and data are; and how the ongoing planning process will be incorporated into existing planning mechanisms.	300
The subapplication describes how the plan will be prepared, who will be involved as part of the mitigation planning team (i.e., specifically which agencies and organizations will participate), who will be responsible for each task, and how key stakeholders will be involved.	300
The risk assessment is the basis for understanding risk and for decision-makers when committing resources to reduce risk. The subapplication describes proposed approach to developing the risk assessment, including hazard identification, profiling, and assessing vulnerability.	50
The costs are reasonable and linked to the Scope of Work and Work Schedule, including costs associated with required revisions, if necessary, and formal adoption. The Work Schedule is reasonable and includes interim milestones (i.e., stakeholder participation and public involvement) as well as overall completion (i.e., State and FEMA review, required revisions, if necessary, and formal adoption).	50
