This letter is a follow-up to our March 2, 2011, pre-application meeting regarding the proposed project in Billings Township, Gladwin County. The purpose of a pre-application meeting is to provide you with information that will clarify the permit process, answer preliminary questions about your specific project in order to avoid delays at a later date, and to determine, if possible, the need for wetland or inland lakes and streams permits.

During this meeting we reviewed whether or not a permit was needed under Part 301, Inland Lakes and Streams, and Part 303, Wetlands Protection, of the Natural Resources and Environmental Protection Act, 1994 PA 451, as amended. The review was based on discussion of the proposed project and/or draft permit application, the proposed site, and potential modifications to the project discussed during our meeting.

This determination is based on the attached project plan prepared by yourself and dated March 2, 2011 along with other attached information provided at the time of this meeting only. Provided that the proposed project and location are not altered, this determination is binding for a period of two years from the date of this meeting.

During the review of the project in office on March 2, 2011 and on site on March 4, 2011, WRD staff made the following findings regarding the need for a permit under Part 301 and Part 303:

- A permit is required for the project as proposed.
- A permit is not required for the project as proposed.
- It cannot be determined whether a permit is required given the information presented at this time.

During the meeting, we also discussed a number of issues related to the project, including the following:

1. The need to obtain a statement from the Air Quality Division
2. The need to obtain a statement from the Environmental Resource Mgmt Division

Please note that this is not a permit. The WRD can not indicate during a pre-application meeting whether or not a permit will be issued. The WRD cannot make a decision regarding a permit until it has considered all of the information provided in the final permit application, and, in some instances, has also considered comments received in response to a public notice of the project. Therefore, WRD staff cannot legally tell you whether the project will be authorized in advance of a permit application.

The file number assigned to this project is 11-26-0005-P. Please keep a record of this file number, and use it when submitting a final application or otherwise corresponding with our office on this project, as this will help to expedite future processing of the application.



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

It appears that you are initiating consultation with the State Historic Preservation Office (SHPO) under Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act of 1966, as amended.

Section 106 requires federal agencies to take into account the effect of their undertakings on historic properties. The Section 106 regulations specify what is required for a Section 106 review [36 CFR § 800.11]. It is the responsibility of the federal agency, not the SHPO, to fulfill the requirements of Section 106. In some instances, the federal agency may delegate legal responsibility to a state, local, or tribal government. Consultants or designees contracted to prepare information, analyses, or recommendations, are not recognized as federally-delegated authorities. For your reference, a complete version of the Section 106 regulations can be found at [www.achp.gov/regs.html](http://www.achp.gov/regs.html).

Under the NPA, applicants are required to use new FCC Form 620 (new tower) and 621 (collocations) to submit Section 106 material to State Historic Preservation Officers (SHPO) or Tribal Historic Preservation Officers (THPO). The new forms appear more like an environmental compliance "project file" rather than a cultural resource review. This puts the burden on the SHPO staff to search through these large documents to extract the specific information needed to review the projects; which is time-consuming and unproductive.

The SHPO receives approximately 3,500 projects for review annually. This year, due to the federal funding for economic stimulus projects, that number has increased significantly. Consistency and accuracy in the information submitted is necessary to facilitate the timely review of each of these projects. For this reason, a mandatory application form was created to would ensure consistency and accuracy in all of the information submitted. As a result, the SHPO has decided to respond to these submissions with a notice that we are declining to consult, unless the Section 106 Application form is used, or historic properties have been identified.

Our letter declining to comment does not imply that the project information is deficient, rather that we have had to make a difficult business decision on how best to utilize our time. Given that the materials are not submitted using our application form, we will not comment on this undertaking. As you know, the 2004 Nationwide Programmatic Agreement (NPA) executed between the (FCC), the Advisory Council on Historic Preservation (ACHP) and the National Conference of State Historic Preservation Officers (NCSHPO) made changes to virtually every aspect of Section 106 review for communications towers. The purpose NPA, which supplements a Collocation Agreement implemented in March 2001, is to streamline the procedures for review of certain FCC undertakings, however in reality, certain stipulations written into the NPA are incongruous with the Michigan SHPO's preferred review process.

The Michigan SHPO application form and instructions for submitting projects for review under Section 106 may be downloaded in MS Word format from our website at [www.michigan.gov/shpo](http://www.michigan.gov/shpo). Due to the large volume of projects submitted to our office, we are unable to accept applications electronically. A hard copy must be submitted for all applications for Section 106 consultation.

The SHPO reserves the right to reconsider any federal undertaking at future planning stages or if significant new data on the project is made available by the sponsoring agency or other interested parties.

(NPA, Section IV.F.4).

Under the authority of Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act of 1966, as amended, we have reviewed the above-cited undertaking at the location noted above. Based on the information provided for our review, it is the opinion of the State Historic Preservation Officer (SHPO) that **no historic properties are affected** within the area of potential effects of this undertaking.

The views of the public are essential to informed decision making in the Section 106 process. The project includes the construction of a 180 foot self supporting communication tower, three antennas, equipment shelter, and a concrete pad.
