Reference is made to your request for a U.S. Army Corps of Engineers' (Corps) jurisdictional determination on property located in Section 40, Township 8 South, Range 12 East, St. Tammany Parish, Louisiana (enclosed map). Specifically, this property is identified as lot 12 at the Huey P. Long fish hatchery.

Based on review of recent maps, aerial photography, soils data, and a brief site inspection conducted on July 7, 2011, we have determined that part of the property is wetland and subject to Corps' jurisdiction. The approximate limits of the wetland are designated in red on the map. A Department of the Army (DA) Section 404 permit will be required prior to the deposition or redistribution of dredged or fill material into this wetland or the areas designated in blue on the map. This wetland, along with Bayou Lacombe, is also subject to Corps' jurisdiction under Section 10 of the Rivers and Harbors Act. A DA Section 10 permit will be required prior to any work in this waterway or the wetland.

Please be advised that this property is in the Louisiana Coastal Zone. For additional information regarding coastal use permit requirements, contact Ms. Christine Charrier, Coastal Management Division, Louisiana Department of Natural Resources at (225) 342-7953.

You are advised that this approved jurisdictional determination is valid for a period of 5 years from the date of this letter unless new information warrants revision prior to the expiration date or the District Commander has identified, after public notice and comment, that specific geographic areas with rapidly changing environmental conditions merit re-verification on a more frequent basis.





Personnel of the Habitat Section of the Coastal & Nongame Resources Division have reviewed the preliminary data for the captioned project.

Bayou Lacombe, which is designated as a Scenic River, is located within a ¼ mile of the proposed project. Contact Keith Cascio with the Louisiana Department of Wildlife and Fisheries at 318-343-4045 concerning this Scenic River.

After careful review of our database, no other impacts to rare, threatened, or endangered species or critical habitats are anticipated for the proposed project. No state or federal parks, wildlife refuges, scenic streams, or wildlife management areas are known at the specified site within Louisiana's boundaries.

The Louisiana Natural Heritage Program (LNHP) has compiled data on rare, endangered, or otherwise significant plant and animal species, plant communities, and other natural features throughout the state of Louisiana. Heritage reports summarize the existing information known at the time of the request regarding the location in question. The quantity and quality of data collected by the LNHP are dependent on the research and observations of many individuals. I have reviewed the above referenced project for potential requirements of the Farmland Protection Policy Act (FPPA) and potential impact to Natural Resource Conservation Service projects in the immediate vicinity.

The Department of Environmental Quality (LDEQ), Business and Community Outreach Division has received your request for comments on the above referenced project.

After reviewing your request, the department has no objections based on the information provided in your submittal. However, for your information, the following general comments have been included. Please be advised that if you should encounter a problem during the implementation of this project, you should immediately notify LDEQ's Single-Point-of-contact (SPOC) at (225) 219-3640.

- Please take any necessary steps to obtain and/or update all necessary approvals and environmental permits regarding this proposed project.
- If your project results in a discharge to waters of the state, submittal of a Louisiana Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (LPDES) application may be necessary.
- If the project results in a discharge of wastewater to an existing wastewater treatment system, that wastewater treatment system may need to modify its LPDES permit before accepting the additional wastewater.
- All precautions should be observed to control nonpoint source pollution from construction activities. LDEQ has stormwater general permits for construction areas equal to or greater than one acre. It is recommended that you contact the LDEQ Water Permits Division at (225) 219-3181 to determine if your proposed project requires a permit.
- If your project will include a sanitary wastewater treatment facility, a Sewage Sludge and Biosolids Use or Disposal Permit application or Notice of Intent must be submitted no later than June 1, 2011. Additional information may be obtained on the LDEQ website at <http://www.deq.louisiana.gov/portal/tabid/2296/Default.aspx> or by contacting the LDEQ Water Permits Division at (225) 219- 3181.

We have received your Solicitation of Views for the above referenced project, which has been found to be inside the Louisiana Coastal Zone. In order for us to properly review and evaluate this project, we require that a complete Coastal Use Permit Application packet (Joint Application Form, locality maps, project illustration plats with plan and cross section views, etc.) along with the appropriate application fee be submitted to our office. Using your complete application, we can provide you with an official determination, and begin the processing of any Coastal Use Permit that may be required for your project. You may obtain a free application packet by calling our office at (225) 342-7591 or (800)-267-4019, or by visiting our website at <http://www.dnr.state.la.us/crm/coastmgt/cup/cup.asp>.

We recommend that, during your planning process, you make every effort to minimize impacts to vegetated wetlands. As our legislative mandate puts great emphasis on avoiding damages to these habitats, in many cases the negotiations involved in reducing such disturbances and developing the required mitigation to offset the lost habitat values delay permit approval longer than any other factor. Additionally, the following sensitive features may require additional processing time by the appropriate resource agencies: A Master Plan feature and CWPPRA and WRDA Fed Diversion project may be affected by the proposed demolition of the buildings located in the Harbor Inn Marina in Slidell, La.

Dear Ms. Zeringue:

Thank you for your letter dated June 8, 2011 and received June 10, 2011 regarding the above-referenced project. We understand that FEMA through its Public Assistance Program proposes to fund (1) the demolition of the pole barn (open shed), (2) the construction of a new office building and parking lot, and (3) the modification of fish ponds at the Huey P. Long Fish Hatchery, located on Davis Avenue, in Lacombe, St. Tammany Parish, Louisiana (Undertaking). We assume that the coordinates are 30.320344°N by -89.943550° W (and not +89.943550°W as stated in the subject line of your letter).

We agree that the Area of Potential Effects (APE) for the built environment contains the Huey P. Long Fish Hatchery, as well as the view shed of the subject property. We also agree that the APE for archaeology consists of the areas where project-related ground-disturbing activities could occur. The APEs for the built environment and archaeology are shown on Figure 2 of your letter.

Furthermore, we understand that based upon your background research, the built environment is not situated within a National Register District, nor has the Huey P. Long Fish Hatchery been individually listed on the National Register of Historic Places. FEMA HP has determined that neither the subject building nor buildings situated within the project view shed retain significance under National Register Criteria A, B and C. Similarly, your background research, combined with a pedestrian survey of the project area and three soil probes yielded no identifiable archaeological deposits within the APE. FEMA HP has determined that the archaeological APE is not eligible for listing on the National Register, nor does it have the potential to yield information under Criterion D.
