

DAM SAFETY INFORMATION

Without logging into the website, you are able to obtain basic dam information by State including dams by hazard potential, # high hazards with EAP (emergency action plans), significant hazards with EAP, dams by height, primary owner type, primary dam type, primary purpose and completion date. So there is some information available without creating an account and logging onto the website.

Anyone can request an account to access the database. They will receive a level of access based on the information they provide. Therefore, a local government official should be able to get access to the database and determine which dams are in or near their jurisdiction. This may have to do with the expanded data available in the database. The latest website is located here:
