


TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE



Communities affected by a disaster often need help to recover from the loss of crucial facilities and infrastructure. Matching community needs to prospective resources — both technical assistance and funding opportunities — is critical to successful recovery.

ESF-14 Long-Term Community Recovery (LTCR), a FEMA program, created the Resource Guide to support community recovery and facilitate matching recovery needs with prospective resources. The Resource Guide helps city officials, recovery stakeholders and community members connect with potential partners and agencies to strengthen development and planning efforts related to a community's long-term recovery.

The Resource Guide provides basic information about local, state and federal government and nonprofit organizations with technical assistance and grant programs applicable to recovery. General descriptions of resources, Web sites, programming objectives, eligible applicants and contact information may change over time.


