MISSION

A. OHA Mission Statement

The Office of Health Affairs (OHA) provides health and medical expertise in support of the DHS mission to prepare for, respond to, and recover from all threats. OHA's responsibilities include: serving as the principal advisor to the Secretary and FEMA Administrator on medical and public health issues; leading and coordinating biological and chemical defense activities; providing medical and scientific expertise to support DHS preparedness and response efforts; and leading the Department's workforce health and medical oversight activities. OHA also serves as the primary DHS point of contact for State and local governments on medical and public health issues.

OHA has four strategic goals that coincide with the strategic goals of the Department:

- 1) Provide expert health and medical advice to DHS leadership
- 2) Build national resilience against health incidents
- 3) Enhance national and DHS medical first responder capabilities
- 4) Protect the DHS workforce against health threats

B. Federal, State, Local, and Tribal Partnerships

OHA serves as a Federal resource and provides products, programs, services and guidance to State, local, tribal, and private sector partners.

C. Building Capabilities and Available Resources

OHA is significant in leading the DHS engagement on public health and medical issues to enhance preparedness and response capabilities, and developing and implementing a multi-layered defensive strategy to protect the Nation from chemical and biological attacks by terrorists. OHA is responsible for developing or enhancing chemical or biological detection and response programs, pandemic influenza preparedness and planning activities, or enhancing medical surge and mass prophylaxis capabilities/ capabilities, to ensure that programs are effectively integrated into current and future Federal capabilities listed below.

Medical First Responder Coordination

Provide Medical Guidance, Standards, Policy, and Outreach to Medical First Responder Stakeholders.

Activity 1: Provide standards and guidelines to DHS components consistent with national and state requirements for the delivery of Emergency Medical Services (EMS).

Activity 2: Ensure that the medical standards and guidelines of care are met by all DHS providers through the delivery of education, medical oversight, continuous quality improvement and related subject matter.

Activity 3: Identify gaps in first responder preparedness, planning, resources and education to ensure seamless integration into readiness and response; and facilitate the integration of the EMS community into Federal, state, local, tribal, and territorial preparedness activities.

Activity 4: Address medical first responder and EMS all-hazard readiness needs in order to provide medical and public health expertise and guidance to other DHS entities.

Activity 5: Partner with other DHS offices, the interagency and the first responder community to address all-hazards preparedness and incorporate medical first responder capabilities into the Department's contingency planning and consequence management efforts.

Medical Liaisons

Provide medical guidance to the DHS operational components on issues related to planning, policy, and response and workforce health protection in order to ensure standardization and alignment with DHS headquarters policy and mission.

Activity 1: Serve as the "trusted agent" of the A/S and CMO to DHS operating components ensuring fulfillment of his statutory role and DHS authorities.

Activity 2: Provide medical and public health subject matter expertise on policy, planning and operations to DHS operating components in line with the DHS and OHA missions.

Activity 3: Provide guidance to operating components related to workforce health protection policy issues.

State and Local Initiatives

Serves as a coordinator of all state and local community activities across OHA to develop preparedness and response capabilities and ensure information sharing.

Activity 1: Enhance coordination of public health and medical information & intelligence sharing strategies with Federal, state, and local stakeholders.

Activity 2: Advance Public Health and Medical preparedness through capabilities development and subject matter expertise to build a more resilient nation to counter a all-hazards event of catastrophic potential.

Activity 3: Improve community and broader societal capabilities to withstand all-hazards events that significantly impact community health and safety, and to rapidly recover to normal or new normal conditions. (Integrating Health security activities into National and local programs that build community resilience)

This initiative supports the National Preparedness Guideline's National Priority: *Strengthen Information Sharing and Collaboration Capabilities*

Planning and Exercise Support

Provides overarching health security-focused contingency planning and exercise expertise to the Federal Interagency, the Department, and State and local entities; and formulates Federal policy recommendations related to Federal and National health security preparedness.

Activity 1: Provide expert health planning support related to Federal planning efforts for CBRNE events.

Activity 2: Provide expert health planning expertise to DHS department planning efforts related to CBRNE preparedness.

Activity 3: Plan for, support and conduct health security-related exercises that focus on developing and enhancing CBRNE preparedness within DHS and among the Federal government.

Activity 4: Develop and promulgate health policy recommendations across the Federal Interagency having Homeland Security and Global Health interests.

Detection

Provide and maintain a continuous bio-terrorism air monitoring system in large metropolitan areas and coordinate with state and local public health communities to prepare for and respond to a bioterrorist event.

Activity 1: Establish processes and methods that evaluate and enhance current laboratory and field operations and that can be adapted for use with automated detection technologies.

Activity 2: Support federal, state and local partners in executing effective BioWatch Actionable Result (BAR) responses using the existing detection technology and adapt responses to automated detection technologies.

Activity 3: Support current automated detection technology acquisition and deployment efforts in coordination with local, state and federal partners.

Activity 4: Develop and establish efficient interagency cooperation and support to state and local partners during a BAR response.

Surveillance

Leads integrated national biosurveillance and provides situational awareness to support the Department's response to incidents of national significance.

Activity 1: Develop and maintain a scalable and flexible capability to support the AS/CMO and senior leaders with situational awareness and provide for information and work flow within OHA during incidents or exigent circumstances.

Activity 2: Develop and implement improvements to the National Biosurveillance Integration Center (NBIC) program to support mission as directed in Public Law 110.53 and the 911 Commission Act of 2007.

Activity 3: Enhance OHA ability to provide coordinated subject matter expertise and situational awareness; and advise on Biological and Chemical Incidents or concerns.

Food Defense and Agriculture Security

Lead the coordination of the Department's programs to ensure the defense of our Nation's food, agriculture, human and animal health in the face of all hazards.

Activity 1: Provide food, agriculture and veterinary subject matter expertise to senior leadership and components of DHS.

Activity 2: Advance State, local, tribal and territorial food, agriculture and veterinary preparedness through capabilities development.

Activity 3: Coordinate, monitor and manage the Department's responsibilities for the implementation of Homeland Security Presidential Directive-9 and collaborate across the interagency for the development of National policy and planning related to the defense of the Agriculture and Food Sector.

D. Conclusion

During FY 2013, OHA will continue to refine and expand program offerings and assistance to State, local and tribal stakeholder partnerships to coordinate delivery of medical surge, biosecurity, and food and agriculture security to enhance local capabilities to respond to and recover from public health and medical events regardless of causation.
