Project Description: Project activities include removing and replacing wood shelves and cabinets, 1,600 square feet vinyl composite tile, 1,200 square feet gypsum wall board, 12,476 square feet acoustic ceiling tiles, various size metal and wooden doors, and various electrical components. Hazard mitigation will be accomplished by placing an adequate concrete curb to anchor and sufficiently raise (5) condensers located on the exterior equipment pad, to be a minimum of 12 inches above disaster event high water mark and shall be 12" freeboard above the disaster event level. Also provide poured in place concrete splash aprons at each roof support column extension, typical at three elevations of the Library facility. This area currently has been eroded by the excessive runoff water from the roof. Installation of mechanically keyed stainless steel "Z" flashing (26 ga, .018" thick), along 14 linear feet per base at each of 10 extensions surrounded by earth. Proposed mitigation will unearth to the top of the "Z" channel above the extension's foundation. The concrete (exposed aggregate) fill will be formed and poured level to the existing grade at (3) sides of the (10) extensions surrounded by earth.

The applicant will not proceed with work until FEMA historic preservation staff have completed consultation with the Louisiana State Historic Preservation Officer (SHPO). In addition, if unmarked graves are present, compliance with the Louisiana Unmarked Human Burial Sites Preservation Act (R.S. 8:671 et seq.) is required. The applicant shall notify the law enforcement agency of the jurisdiction where the remains are located within twenty-four hours of the discovery. The applicant shall also notify FEMA and the Louisiana Unmarked Burial Sites Board (call the Louisiana Division of Archeology at 225-342-8170) within seventy-two hours of the discovery. Failure to comply with these stipulations may jeopardize receipt of FEMA funding. If the scope of work changes to include further ground disturbing activities, this project will need to be resubmitted for further historic review.
