Project activities also include removing and replacing 4,235 square feet of built up roof and 4,743 square feet of plaster walls. This project has four hazard mitigation proposals attached. HMP 1 is to elevate the pad mounted air conditioning unit 48". HMP 2 is to relocate the water heaters to the second floor. HMP 3 is to replace 4,743 square feet of plaster wall with "high abuse" gypsum wall board and HMP 4 is to replace the vinyl composite floor tile with sheet vinyl floor tile.
