Project Description: On August 29 Hurricane Katrina made landfall, causing high winds, flooding and flying debris and extensively damaging the Orleans Parish 3rd District Police Complex. Damages to the building included: 28 doors, 2 double doors, timber studs (36 LF), metal studs (400 LF), carpet (77 SY), baseboard moldings (749 LF), drywall (11,344 SF), suspended ceiling tiles (8,306 SF), floor tiles (7,746 SF), 75 gal gas fired water heater, two 5-ton HVAC systems with condensing and evaporating units, one 10-ton HVAC system including condensing unit and evaporating unit. Two HVAC aluminum air supply grills, one HVAC electronic thermostat, one HVAC ½" refrigerant pipe with insulation, electrical wiring, outlets, switches, and circuit panel boards and equipment, structural crack (10 SF), broken window glass (80 SF), and one 9' x 5' window.

Hazard Mitigation proposes to mitigate water damage to the 3rd District Operation Division Building network cabling caused by flooding. The scope of work includes the replacement of the following electrical equipment: 30 Voice/Data outlets two jack openings, 20 C.L.F. Category 5 cabling and 100 Category 5 connectors (RJ-45), with the following equipment: 2 Wireless Access Points, 5 C.L.F. Category 5 cabling, 10 Category 5 connectors (RJ-45) and 25 Wireless PCI Adaptors.

Project Conditions:

- This project is located within the Louisiana Coastal Management Zone. Any change to the approved scope of work will require re-submission to FEMA for re-evaluation for consistency with LCMP. - Ensure that if damaged AC unit contains refrigerant that is an ozone depleting substance subject to Clean Air Act requirements, that this refrigerant is removed and recovered by Certified Chlorofluorocarbon (CFC) technician per 40 CFR Part 82, and that documentation of appropriate disposal is obtained.
- The City of New Orleans / Orleans Parish enrolled in the National Flood Insurance Policy (NFIP) on 08-03-70. Per Flood Insurance Rate Map (FIRM) panel number 225203 0095E, dated 08/03/70, project is located in a Zone "B", area protected from 100-yr flood by levee, dike, or other structure subject to failure or overtopping during larger floods. Per E.O. 11988 an 8-step process is attached, clarification of Step 2: A cumulative public notice was published in the Times Picayune Nov. 7-9, 2005. Project is repair of building and replacement of contents, which per flood recovery guidance, dated 04/12/2006 should, where possible, be elevated to an elevation of at least 3 feet above ground level. The applicant must comply with E.O. 11988, completing the 8-step process; follow all applicable local, state and federal laws, regulations and requirements; obtain and comply with all required permits and approvals prior to initiating work on this project. Per 44 CFR 9.12, applicant must publish a final public notice 15 days prior to the start of construction activities. Documentation of completed 8-step process and final notice is to be forwarded to the Louisiana Office of Homeland Security Emergency Preparedness and Federal Emergency Management Agency for inclusion in the permanent project files.

No extraordinary circumstances as described in 44 CFR 10.8(d)(3) were identified during project review.
