FEMA/State Disaster Recovery Center in Forrest County Changes Hours of Operation Saturday; Sets Tentative Closing Date

HATTIESBURG, MS – The MEMA/FEMA Disaster Recovery Center in Forrest County will no longer be open Saturdays. New hours of operation at the center are 9 a.m. to 6 p.m., Monday through Friday, effectively immediately.

The center also is tentatively set to close at 6 p.m. Wednesday, March 22, 2017.

MEMA and FEMA encourage Mississippi survivors who registered for disaster assistance with FEMA to stay in touch. If survivors change mailing addresses or phone numbers, they should update FEMA with the information. Missing or incorrect information could result in delays in receiving assistance.

If you haven't contacted FEMA to register for possible assistance, do so as soon as possible because the deadline to register is Monday, March 27. Register:

Survivors requiring a reasonable accommodation (American Sign Language interpreting, Braille, large print, etc.) while visiting the disaster recovery center may call the Helpline number listed above for support. These toll-free numbers are open from 7 a.m. to 11 p.m., seven days a week.

FEMA assistance is nontaxable and will not affect eligibility for Social Security, Medicaid, Medicare or other federal benefits.

Register even if you have insurance. FEMA cannot duplicate insurance payments, but if you are underinsured you may receive help after your claim has been settled.
