

Disaster Recovery Center in Orlando Will Transition to SBA Disaster Loan

ORLANDO, Fla. —The FEMA Disaster Recovery Center in Orlando is closing Wednesday, December 20, and will reopen at the same location as a U.S. Small Business Administration Disaster Loan Outreach Center (DLOC) on Thursday, December 21. Hours are 9 a.m. – 7 p.m., closed Sundays.

The transition from FEMA to SBA will mean the center is primarily staffed by SBA personnel, however, a few FEMA representatives will be present to answer questions from survivors.

SBA customer service representatives are available to meet with business owners and residents to answer questions, explain SBA's disaster loan program and close their approved disaster loans. Business owners and residents can meet with SBA representatives on the days and times indicated. No appointment is necessary.

Applicants for disaster loans may apply online using the electronic loan application via SBA's secure website at disasterloan.sba.gov/ela.

However, applicants who receive SBA loan applications must submit them to SBA to be eligible for assistance that covers personal property, vehicle repair or replacement, and moving and storage expenses.
