

FEMA Disaster Registration Slated for Manu'a Islands

PAGO PAGO, American Samoa – American Samoan and FEMA teams will register Manu'a residents who suffered losses from Tropical Storm Gita to determine their eligibility for federal assistance.

Residents who suffered damage from Tropical Storm Gita can register at the following locations between 8 a.m. and 4 p.m. Wednesday, April 4 through Saturday, April 7.

Ofu & Olosega - 1 site

Ofu Executive Office Building (EOB)

Ta'u (Fitiuta, Faleasao, & Ta'u) – 2 sites

Ta'u Executive Office Building (EOB)

Fitiuta Airport Station (ARFF Station)

Residents should have the following information at hand to complete the registration.

- Social Security number.
- Location of the damaged primary residence.
- Description of the damage.
- Information about insurance coverage if applicable.
- A current contact telephone number.
- An address where they can receive mail.
- Bank account and routing numbers for direct deposit of funds.
