WASHINGTON — The whole-of-America response to fighting the COVID-19 pandemic continues, with National Guardsmen helping deliver medical supplies, medical professionals treating patients and ventilators being shipped throughout the country.

Under the White House Coronavirus Task Force's direction, FEMA, HHS and our federal partners are working with state, local, tribal and territorial governments to execute a whole-of-America response to fight the COVID-19 pandemic and protect the public. FEMA has obligated more than \$3.2 billion in support of these efforts, as federal agencies continue working to meet demands for personal protective equipment.

All 50 states, the District of Columbia, five territories, and 18 tribes are working directly with FEMA under the nationwide emergency declaration for COVID-19.
