## Puerto Rico Rebuilding

### Public Assistance

\$34.7 Billion Total Obligated (Project Worksheets obligated - 11,061)

- \$706.4 million funding for Debris Removal
- \$4.7 billion funding for Emergency Protective Measures
- \$29.3 billion Permanent Work and Management Costs
