

# Free Legal Help Available for New Jersey Ida Survivors

A free legal service is available for people facing legal issues due to the remnants of Hurricane Ida.

Residents in **Bergen, Essex, Gloucester, Hudson, Hunterdon, Mercer, Middlesex, Morris, Passaic, Somerset, Union** and **Warren** counties affected by the disaster who are unable to afford a lawyer can request free legal assistance from the Legal Services of New Jersey's (LSNJ) statewide hotline at [www.lsnjlawhotline.org](http://www.lsnjlawhotline.org). The online application can be submitted any time.

Residents can also call the LSNJ hotline at **888-576-5529** (888-LSNJ-LAW). Hours of operation are 8 a.m. to 5:30 p.m.

This service is a partnership between the New Jersey State Bar Association, the American Bar Association's Young Lawyers Division and FEMA.

## Types of free legal assistance available include

- Help securing FEMA and other government benefits available to disaster survivors
- Assistance with life, medical and property insurance claims
- Replacement of wills and other important legal documents lost or destroyed in the disaster
- Counseling on creditor-debtor problems
- Counseling on landlord-tenant problems
