## AIR SUPPORT GROUP SUPERVISOR

<b>RESOURCE CATEGORY</b>	Incident Management
<b>RESOURCE KIND</b>	Personnel
<b>OVERALL FUNCTION</b>	The Air Support Group Supervisor assists with flight crew ground needs and coordinates with the Air Tactical Group Supervisor to help ensure mission's success and crew safety
<b>COMPOSITION AND ORDERING SPECIFICATIONS</b>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. This position can be ordered as a single resource</li> <li>2. Requestor specifies any additional qualifications necessary based on incident complexity and needs</li> <li>3. Discuss logistics for deploying this position, such as working conditions, length of deployment, security, lodging, transportation, and meals, prior to deployment</li> </ol>

Each type of resource builds on the qualifications of the type below it. For example, Type 1 qualifications include the qualifications in Type 2, plus an increase in capability. Type 1 is the highest qualification level.

<b>DESCRIPTION</b>	<p>The Air Support Group Supervisor:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Coordinates the ground needs of the flight crews and their aircraft through the Air Operations Branch Director</li> <li>2. Assists and coordinates with the Air Tactical Group Supervisor to help ensure mission's success and crew safety</li> <li>3. Assists the Air Tactical Group Supervisor during in-flight emergencies (IFE)</li> <li>4. Ensures adequate aircraft servicing is available and meets aircraft fuel needs</li> <li>5. Accounts for aircrew between missions and meets crew rest and billeting needs</li> <li>6. Coordinates with local airfield managers and fixed base operators (FBO)</li> <li>7. Reports mission-essential information to the Air Operations Branch Director</li> <li>8. Coordinates with the Air Tactical Group Supervisor to provide information to the Air Operations Branch Director for the daily situation report</li> <li>9. Establishes or transitions into a group under the Operations Section in the Incident Command System (ICS)</li> <li>10. Supervises and configures group with units as necessary</li> </ol>	Not Specified

ICS-400: Advanced Incident Command System for Command and General Staff – Complex Incidents</li> <li>5. IS-700: National Incident Management System, An Introduction</li> <li>6. IS-800: National Response Framework, An Introduction</li> <li>7. E/L 0986: NIMS ICS All-Hazards Air Support Group Supervisor</li> <li>8. <b>EXPERIENCE</b>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Successful completion of National Qualification System (NQS) Position Task Book (PTB) for the National Incident Management System (NIMS) Air Support Group Supervisor, or equivalent Authority Having Jurisdiction (AHJ) documentation</li> <li>2. Experience in an air operations position AND participation in three or more exercise activations or real-world activations with one or more operational periods</li> </ol>	Military rating (current or former) as a pilot or navigator may fulfill this experience
<b>PHYSICAL / MEDICAL FITNESS</b>	Light	The NIMS Guideline for the NQS defines Physical/Medical Fitness levels for NQS positions.
<b>CURRENCY</b>	Functions in this position during an operational incident, planned event, exercise, drill, or simulation at least once every three years	Military experience may fulfill this currency
<b>PROFESSIONAL AND TECHNICAL LICENSES AND CERTIFICATIONS</b>	Not Specified	Not Specified
