I. Legislative Language

This document has been compiled pursuant to language set forth in the Fiscal Year (FY) 2022 Further Continuing Appropriations Act (P.L. 117-86), which extends the terms and conditions of the FY 2021 Department of Homeland Security Appropriations Act (P.L. 116-260) and its accompanying Joint Explanatory Statement and House Report 116-458; and in the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act (P.L. 116-136).

P.L. 117-86 states:

SEC. 101. The Continuing Appropriations Act, 2022 (division A of Public Law 117–43) is amended—

(1) by striking the date specified in section 106(3) and inserting "March 11, 2022"...

P.L. 117-43 states:

The following sums are hereby appropriated, out of any money in the Treasury not otherwise appropriated, and out of applicable corporate or other revenues, receipts, and funds, for the several departments, agencies, corporations, and other organizational units of Government for fiscal year 2022, and for other purposes, namely:

SEC. 101. Such amounts as may be necessary, at a rate for operations as provided in the applicable appropriations Acts for fiscal year 2021 and under the authority and conditions provided in such Acts, for continuing projects or activities (including the costs of direct loans and loan guarantees) that are not otherwise specifically provided for in this Act, that were conducted in fiscal year 2021, and for which appropriations, funds, or other authority were made available in the following appropriations Acts:

... (6) The Department of Homeland Security Appropriations Act, 2021 (division F of Public Law 116-260), except section 538, and including sections 101 through 103 and section 105 of title I of division O of Public Law 116-260.

SEC. 106. Unless otherwise provided for in this Act or in the applicable appropriations Act for fiscal year 2022, appropriations and funds made available and authority granted pursuant to this Act shall be available until whichever of the following first occurs:

(1) The enactment into law of an appropriation for any project or activity provided for in this Act.

(2) The enactment into law of the applicable appropriations Act for fiscal year 2022 without any provision for such project or activity.

(3) December 3, 2021.

P.L. 116-260 (referenced above) states:

The reporting requirements in paragraphs (1) and (2) under the heading "Federal Emergency Management Agency-Disaster Relief Fund" in the Department of Homeland Security Appropriations Act, 2015 (Public Law 114-4) shall be applied in fiscal year 2021 with respect to budget year 2022 and current fiscal year 2021, respectively-

(1) in paragraph (1) by substituting "fiscal year 2022" for "fiscal year 2016"; and
(2) in paragraph (2) by inserting "business" after "fifth".

P.L. 114-4 (referenced above) states:

Provided, That the Administrator of the Federal Emergency Management Agency shall submit to the Committees on Appropriations of the Senate and the House of Representatives the following reports, including a specific description of the methodology and the source data used in developing such reports.

(2) an estimate or actual amounts, if available, of the following for the current fiscal year shall be submitted not later than the fifth day of each month, and shall be published by the Administrator on the Agency's Web site not later than the fifth day of each month:

- (A) a summary of the amount of appropriations made available by source, the transfers executed, the previously allocated funds recovered, and the commitments, allocations, and obligations made;
- (B) a table of disaster relief activity delineated by month, including-
 - (i) the beginning and ending balances;

(ii) the total obligations to include amounts obligated for fire assistance, emergencies, surge, and disaster support activities;

(iii) the obligations for catastrophic events delineated by event and bystate; and

- (iv) the amount of previously obligated funds that are recovered;
- (C) a summary of allocations, obligations, and expenditures for catastrophic events delineated by event;

- (D) in addition, for a disaster declaration related to Hurricane Sandy, the cost of the following categories of spending: public assistance, individual assistance, mitigation, administrative, operations, and any other relevant category (including emergency measures and disaster resources); and
- (E) the date on which funds appropriated will be exhausted...

P.L. 116-136 states:

Provided further, That every 30 days the Administrator shall provide the Committees on Appropriations of the Senate and the House of Representatives both projected and actual costs for funds provided under this heading for major disasters and any other expenses...

This report covers activities as of February 28, 2022.

II. Background

P.L. 116-260 requires that the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) Administrator provide a report by the fifth business day of each month on the Disaster Relief Fund (DRF) that includes a funding summary, a table delineating DRF funding activities each month by state and event, a summary of the funding for the catastrophic events, and the fund exhaustion date, or end-of-fiscal-year balance.

P.L. 116-136 requires that both projected and actual costs for funds provided by it for major disasters and any other expenses be provided to the House and Senate Appropriations Committees.

Consequently, the following report elements are included:

- 1. Appendix A is an appropriations summary that includes a synopsis of the amount of appropriations made available by source, the transfers executed, the previously allocated funds recovered, and the commitments, allocations, and obligations.
- 2. Appendix B presents details on the DRF funding activities delineated by month.
- 3. Appendix C presents obligations and estimates by spending category for Hurricanes Sandy, Harvey, Irma, and Maria; Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19); and declarations since August 1, 2017.
- 4. Appendix D presents funding summaries for the current active catastrophic events including the allocations, obligations, and expenditures.
- 5. Appendix E presents the fund exhaustion date, or end-of-fiscal-year balance.
- 6. Appendix F presents a bridge table that provides explanation for the monthly and baseline change for all activities to include details for catastrophic events.
- 7. Appendix G presents the fund history and current status of the Building Resilient Infrastructure and Communities (BRIC)/Pre-Disaster Mitigation (PDM) program.

The BRIC funding continues to be available to FEMA for other purposes should the DRF Majors balance drop too low to cover immediate response or recovery needs.
