**SUBJECT:** Awards for the Fiscal Year 2023 Tribal Cybersecurity Grant Program

Today, the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) and the Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency (CISA), both components of the U.S. Department of Homeland Security (DHS), are announcing the release of the Fiscal Year (FY) 2023 awards for the Tribal Cybersecurity Grant Program (TCGP).

TCGP is an innovative program established through the Infrastructure, Investment, and Jobs Act, also known as the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (Pub. L. No. 117-58). The TCGP is a grant program that addresses cybersecurity risks and cybersecurity threats to information systems owned or operated by, or on behalf of, Tribal Nations.

The FY 2023 TCGP provides \$18,246,845 in federal assistance to Tribal Nations. The FY 2023 TCGP Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO) may be found online at <https://www.fema.gov/grants/preparedness/tribal-cybersecurity-grant-program>. This goal can be achieved over the course of the period of performance of TCGP funding as applicants focus their cybersecurity plans, priorities, and projects, and implement the TCGP objectives.

Based on the consideration of national priorities, frameworks, and the national cyber threat environment, FEMA and CISA developed four overarching objectives for the TCGP:

1. Establish cyber governance and planning;
2. Assess and evaluate systems and capabilities;
3. Implement security protections commensurate with risk; and
4. Build and train a cybersecurity workforce.
