# Investment Justification (IJ) Checklist

Nonprofit Security Grant Program (NSGP)

## **Application Overview**

Nonprofit organizations apply for NSGP funding through their State Administrative Agency (SAA). FEMA's application requirements for nonprofit organizations include the organization's Mission Statement, a completed Vulnerability Assessment, and a completed Investment Justification (IJ). **FEMA only uses the IJ in its federal review.** 

SAAs might have additional application requirements. Nonprofit organizations do NOT apply directly to FEMA and should contact their SAA to confirm any state-specific requirements.

### **Investment Justification (IJ)**

The IJ summarizes the nonprofit organization's most significant application information, including the organization's vulnerability, the threats/risks faced, and how to mitigate known security gaps at the organization's location identified in the Vulnerability Assessment. Nonprofit organizations must fully answer each question in all IJ sections for the IJ to be considered complete and sent for both state and federal review. Listed below is the content that is required to complete the NSGP IJ.
