SUBJECT: Fiscal Year 2024 Notices of Funding Opportunity

Today, the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), a component of the U.S. Department of Homeland Security (DHS), announced the availability of the Fiscal Year (FY) 2024 Notices of Funding Opportunity (NOFO) for eight grant programs. The NOFOs released today represent \$1,800,050,000 in available FY 2024 federal assistance and may be found online at http://www.fema.gov/grants and at http://www.grants.gov.

Eligible applicants must apply for funding through the FEMA Grants Outcomes (FEMA GO) system portal at http://go.fema.gov/. The following forms or information are required to be submitted via FEMA GO. The Standard Forms (SF) are also available at https://grants.gov/forms/forms-repository/sf-424-family.

Applicants are strongly encouraged to begin the application process as soon as possible, including obtaining a Unique Entity Identifier (UEI) number. The UEI is a 12-character alphanumeric identification assigned to an entity by the System for Award Management (see SAM.gov). The UEI is a required application element and may take up to four weeks to obtain. Instructions on how to request a UEI can be found at https://sam.gov/content/entity-registration. To obtain the UEI, all applicants must register with SAM. Failure to register with SAM will prevent an applicant from completing the application in FEMA GO. Applicants are strongly encouraged to begin their application in FEMA GO at the time of this announcement to ensure they have adequate time to start and complete their submission. Completed applications for all grant programs must be submitted in FEMA GO no later than 5 p.m. Eastern Time (ET), June 24, 2024.

Only final submissions made through the FEMA GO system located at http://go.fema.gov/will be accepted. If you, the applicant, need assistance registering for the FEMA GO system, please contact the FEMA GO Helpdesk at fema.gov or (877) 585-3242, Monday through Friday, 9 a.m. – 6 p.m. ET.

FY 2024 Homeland Security Grant Program (HSGP)

HSGP includes a suite of risk-based grants to assist state, local, tribal and territorial efforts to prevent, prepare for, protect against, and respond to acts of terrorism. The grants included under HSGP are:

State Homeland Security Program (SHSP)* In FY 2024, SHSP provides \$373.5 million to assist state, local, tribal, and territorial governments in preventing, preparing for, protecting against, and responding to acts of terrorism.

Urban Area Security Initiative (UASI)* In FY 2024, UASI provides \$553.5 million to assist high-risk urban areas in preventing, preparing for, protecting against, and responding to acts of terrorism.

Operation Stonegarden (OPSG) In FY 2024, OPSG provides \$81 million to support enhanced cooperation and coordination among state, local, tribal, territorial, and federal law enforcement agencies in a joint mission to secure the United States' borders along routes of ingress from international borders, to include travel corridors in states bordering Mexico and Canada, as well as states and territories with international water borders.

FY 2024 Tribal Homeland Security Grant Program (THSGP)

In FY 2024, THSGP provides \$13.5 million to directly eligible tribes to support the building, sustainment, and delivery of core capabilities to enable tribes to strengthen their capacity to prevent, prepare for, protect against, and respond to potential terrorist attacks. As in previous fiscal years, the THSGP will be a competitive grant program.

FY 2024 Nonprofit Security Grant Program (NSGP)*

In FY 2024, NSGP provides \$274.5 million in funding support for hardening and other physical security enhancements to nonprofit organizations that are at high risk of terrorist or other extremist attacks. Of this amount, \$137.25 million is available to nonprofit organizations located within one of the FY 2024 UASI-designated high-risk urban areas (NSGP-Urban Area or NSGP-UA). Additional, separate funding in the amount of \$137.25 million is also appropriated for nonprofit organizations located outside of the FY 2024 UASI-designated high-risk urban areas (NSGP-State or NSGP-S*). As in previous fiscal years, the NSGP will be a competitive grant program.

FY 2024 Transit Security Grant Program (TSGP)

In FY 2024, TSGP provides \$83.7 million to support transportation infrastructure security activities. The TSGP provides funds to eligible public transportation systems (which include intra-city bus, commuter bus, ferries, and all forms of passenger rail) that serve historically eligible UASI-designated high-risk urban areas to protect critical surface transportation infrastructure and the traveling public from acts of terrorism and to increase the resilience of transit infrastructure. As in previous fiscal years, the TSGP will be a competitive grant program.

FY 2024 Intercity Passenger Rail (IPR) – Amtrak Program

In FY 2024, IPR provides \$9 million to the National Passenger Railroad Corporation (Amtrak) to protect critical surface transportation infrastructure and the traveling public from acts of terrorism and to increase the resilience of the Amtrak rail system.

FY 2024 Intercity Bus Security Grant Program (IBSGP)

In FY 2024, IBSGP provides \$1.8 million to owners and operators of intercity bus systems providing services to historically eligible UASI-designated high-risk urban areas, to protect critical surface transportation infrastructure and the traveling public from acts of terrorism and to increase the resilience of transit infrastructure. As in previous fiscal years, the IBSGP will be a competitive grant program.

FY 2024 Port Security Grant Program (PSGP)

In FY 2024, PSGP provides \$90 million to provide funds to port authorities, facility operators, and state, local, and territorial agencies required to provide security services to implement Area

Maritime Security Plans, facility security plans, and other port-wide risk management activities. As in previous fiscal years, the PSGP will be a competitive grant program.

FY 2024 Emergency Management Performance Grant (EMPG) Program*

In FY 2024, the EMPG Program provides \$319.5 million to assist state, local, tribal, and territorial governments in preparing for all hazards. In addition to this funding, FEMA must also make available \$50,000 from the Disaster Relief Fund to the Republic of the Marshall Islands pursuant to Article X of the Federal Programs and Services Agreement of the *Compact of Free Association Amendments Act of 2003*, as amended, Pub. L. No. 108-188.
