# **AIR OPERATIONS BRANCH DIRECTOR**

RESOURCE CATEGORY	Incident Management
RESOURCE KIND	Personnel
OVERALL FUNCTION	The Air Operations Branch Director helps ensure the safe and efficient use of aviation resources.
COMPOSITION AND ORDERING SPECIFICATIONS	<ol> <li>This position can be ordered as a single resource or in conjunction with a National Incident Management System (NIMS) typed team (Incident Management Team).</li> <li>Discuss logistics for deploying this position, such as working conditions, length of deployment, security, lodging, transportation and meals, prior to deployment.</li> <li>Requestor specifies any additional qualifications necessary, based on incident complexity and needs.</li> </ol>

Each type of resource builds on the qualifications of the type below it. For example, Type 1 qualifications include the qualifications in Type 2, plus an increase in capability. Type 1 is the highest qualification level.

DESCRIPTION	<ol> <li>The Air Operations Branch Director:         <ol> <li>Establishes or transitions into a branch under the Operations Section in the Incident Command System (ICS)</li> <li>Supervises and configures the branch with groups as necessary</li> <li>Maintains full operational control over incident-related air and support assets or coordinates the deployment of and support for Air Operations resources</li> <li>Assesses both manned and unmanned air resource needs and ensures the appropriate use of both under Air Operations</li> <li>Maintains accountability for all incident air assets</li> <li>Oversees mobilization and demobilization of air resources</li> <li>Ensures airspace safety and deconfliction by coordinating temporary flight restrictions (TFR) and flight routes</li> </ol> </li> <li>Monitors all significant air resource problems and emergencies, and reports them to appropriate personnel</li> <li>Coordinates air resource needs and use with state and federal agency representatives</li> <li>Supports the Operations Section Chief or Incident Commander (IC) based on their requirements related to the Incident Action Plan (IAP)</li> </ol>	Not Specified

PHYSICAL / MEDICAL FITNESS	Light	The NIMS Guideline for the NQS defines Physical/Medical Fitness levels for NQS positions.
CURRENCY	Functions in this position or a higher position during a qualifying incident, planned event, exercise, drill or simulation at least once every three years	<ol> <li>Military experience may fulfill this currency requirement.</li> <li>A higher position is one for which this position is a prerequisite within the Operations Section.</li> </ol>
