CERTIFIED NURSING ASSISTANT (CNA)

RESOURCE KIND	Personnel
OVERALL FUNCTION	The Certified Nursing Assistant (CNA) assists in direct patient care and documents and records patient conditions and treatment
COMPOSITION AND ORDERING SPECIFICATIONS	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. This position can be ordered as a single resource or in conjunction with a NIMS typed team (such as the Public Health and Medical Shelter Support Team or Isolation and Quarantine Team) 2. Discuss logistics for this position, such as security, lodging, transportation and meals prior to deployment 3. The position typically works 12 hours per shift, is self-sustainable for 72 hours and is deployable for up to 14 days

Each type of resource builds on the qualifications of the type below it. For example, Type 1 qualifications include the qualifications in Type 2, plus an increase in capability. Type 1 is the highest qualification level.

DESCRIPTION	<p>The CNA:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Assists in direct patient care 2. Grooming and bathing patients with low mobility 3. Providing patients rooms with necessary items like blankets, pillows, medical equipment and bathroom needs 4. Making sure patients have regular meals 5. Turning or adjusting patients in bed to prevent bedsores or other discomforts 6. Exercising patients by helping them walk 7. Documents vital signs, height, weight, input (such as fluid intake) and output (such as elimination or emptying of and measuring nasogastric tubes and catheter collection devices) 8. Reports and records patient conditions and treatments 9. Collects specimens 10. Assists with patient movement and mobility, positioning and transfers under the supervision of nursing staff 11. Performs assigned procedures (such as catheter insertion) for which the Technician has training, knowledge and skills and has received competency verification 	Not Specified

Immunizations up-to-date and commensurate with mission assignment 4. Background checks as applicable law permits or requires 	Provider must carry out and use any background checks as applicable law specifies. This may include a: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Background check completed within the past 12 months 2. Sex-offender registry check 3. Local, state and or national criminal history check
PROFESSIONAL AND TECHNICAL LICENSES AND CERTIFICATIONS	State, District of Columbia or US territory-granted active status of legal authority to function as a CNA or Patient Care Technician without restrictions	Not Specified
