Jarrod Goentzel is founder and director of the Humanitarian Supply Chain Lab in the MIT Center for Transportation and Logistics. His research focuses on meeting human needs in resource-constrained settings through better supply chain management, information systems, and decision support technology. Dr. Goentzel leads fieldwork in a range of contexts engaging public, private, and nonprofit sectors to improve response efforts during emergencies and strengthen supply chains in vulnerable communities. Previously, Dr. Goentzel was Executive Director of the MIT Supply Chain Management (SCM) Program, a nine-month master's degree program. He joined MIT in 2003 to establish the Zaragoza Logistics Center in Spain, which was the first node in the MIT Global SCALE Network. He received a Ph.D. in industrial and systems engineering from Georgia Tech.
